The Ackerman winds were in full force, as Strength, Passion and Focus became distinct characteristics of the 2006 "This Run's For Jack" participants. Runners and walkers, ranging in ages from 3 to 77 years old, gathered in front of the band shell un-intimidated by wind gusts of 24 mph and a starting temperature of 34 degrees. In spite of the weather conditions, warmth penetrated from the crowd as 700 runners, 206 walk-up registrants and 200 volunteers shared smiles and words of encouragement.

Our success is not only measured in dollars, but is more accurately reflected in the fellowship formed with families that return each year, committed to making a difference in the fight against this disease.

The 2006 donations continue to climb. With the combined effort of the marathon team, sponsor support and 5K donations, the total is **over \$80,000**. We are extremely grateful and overwhelmed with your generosity. These funds will be used to educate people about the risks and symptoms of melanoma, as well as support promising research toward a cure and help the countless others now fighting for their lives


